English

Fiction – This term the children will be writing a 'warning tale' story and a 'meeting' story

Non-Fiction - Children will be writing instructions and a non-chronological report.

Poetry - Children will be recognising and writing some different forms of poetry.

Whole class guided reading sessions will happen twice weekly.

Spellings and phonics lessons also happen twice weekly.

Handwriting - our handwriting will follow the Nelson cursive scheme without lead-ins.

Maths

We will be following the 'Mastery for maths' approach to teaching mathematics. We will be covering the following units this term.

- Number and Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- •Geometry shape
- Multiplication and Division A

Children will be learning mental strategies, written methods and solving reasoning problems in everyday

Music:

Writing Music Down: including long and short (rhythm) and high and low (pitch) sounds can be represented by musical symbols.

Playing in a Band: to include how in music, the steady beat is organised by time signatures which tell us how many beats there are in each bar.

Science:

Plants - Children will revise and revisit previous learning on Plants with a particular focus on light. Animals including humans - Children will identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat. Rocks - We will compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties, describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock and recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.

DT: Food and healthy eating - making soup Levers and linkages - Christmas Card

PE – The children will learn to play competitive games and apply basic principles suitable for attacking and defending as well as running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination.

In Activsports sessions, the children will be focused on fitness, developing ball skills in football and performing sequences of movement and balance in gymnastics. In their other PE lesson, the children will be attending weekly swimming sessions at Market Drayton Swimming Pool on Friday mornings, after half term. We will also be doing the mile run on non-PE days.

PSHE: This subject filters into every aspect of school life and there will continue to be a focus on 'British Values'. Our weekly lessons will focus on Safety and First Aid including: -

- Keeping and Staying Safe Staying Safe and Leaning out of windows.
- -Keeping and Staying Healthy Medicine.
- -Relationships Touch.
- -Calling for help
- -Basic life support
- -Bites and Stings

Art

As well as drawing and painting skills lessons, the children will be exploring the various styles of cave paintings left by Stone Age peoples and will be recreating some of their own, using mixed media. They will also be working in

3D, making a simple pinch/ thumb clay pot in the style of early Bronze and Iron Age cultures.

Computing: Computing systems and networks - Connecting Computers. The children will develop their understanding of digital devices, with a focus on inputs, processes and outputs. The pupils will compare digital/nondigital devices, learn about computer networks including devices that make a network's infrastructure, such as wireless access points and switches. The unit concludes with pupils discovering the benefits of connecting devices in a network.
